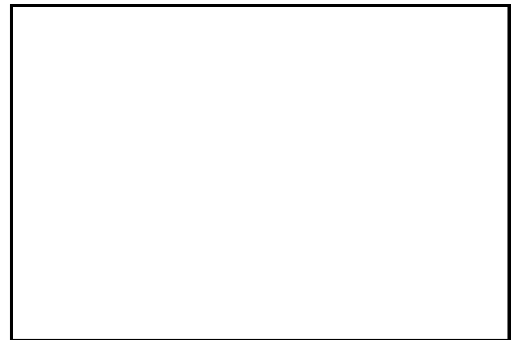

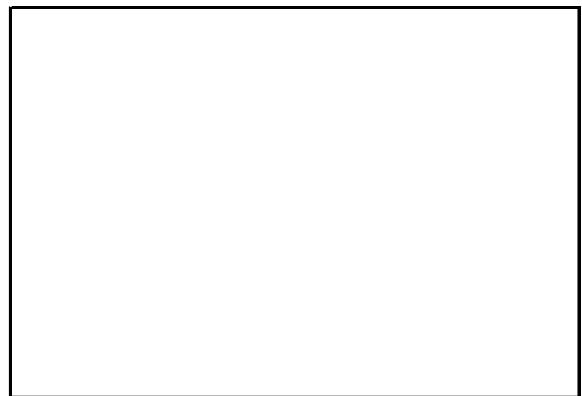

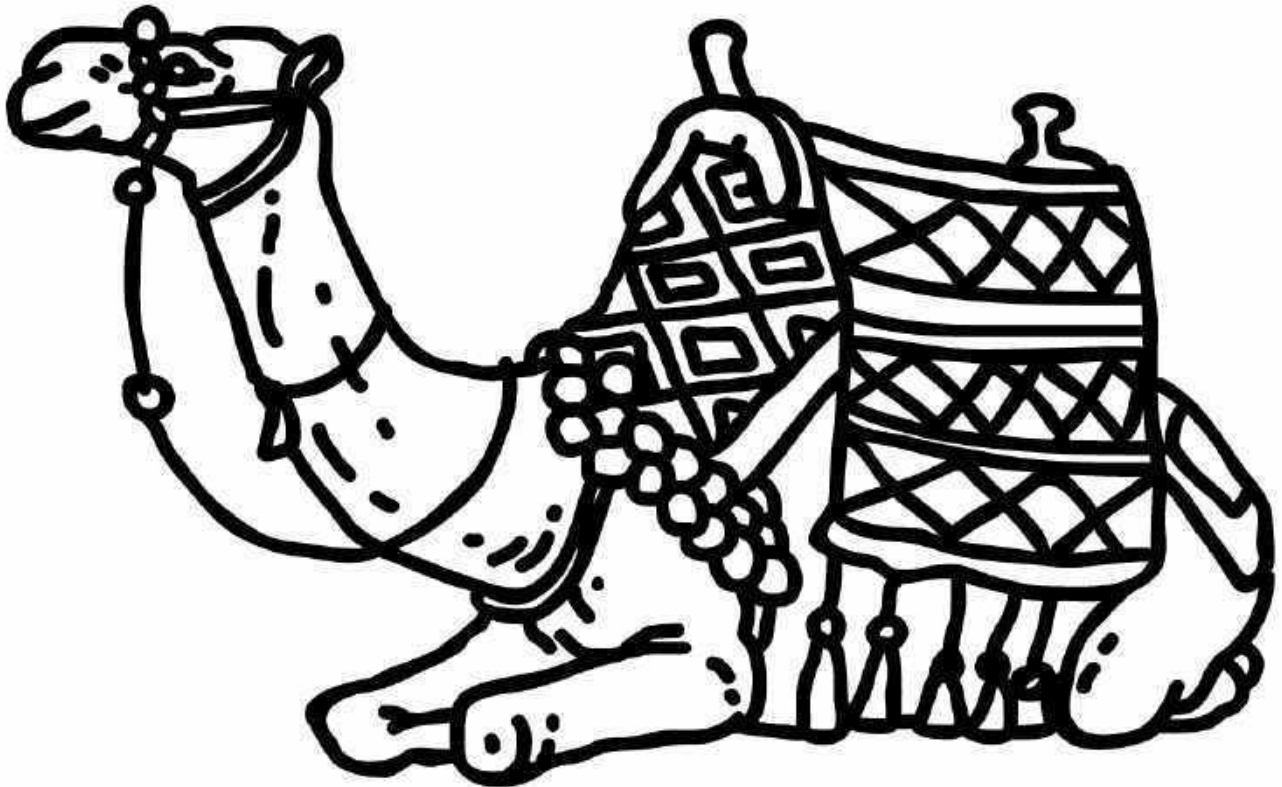

The northern region of Egypt is bounded by two deserts whereas the western part covers almost 700000 square kilometers. The Western Desert of Egypt is a part of the Sahara. 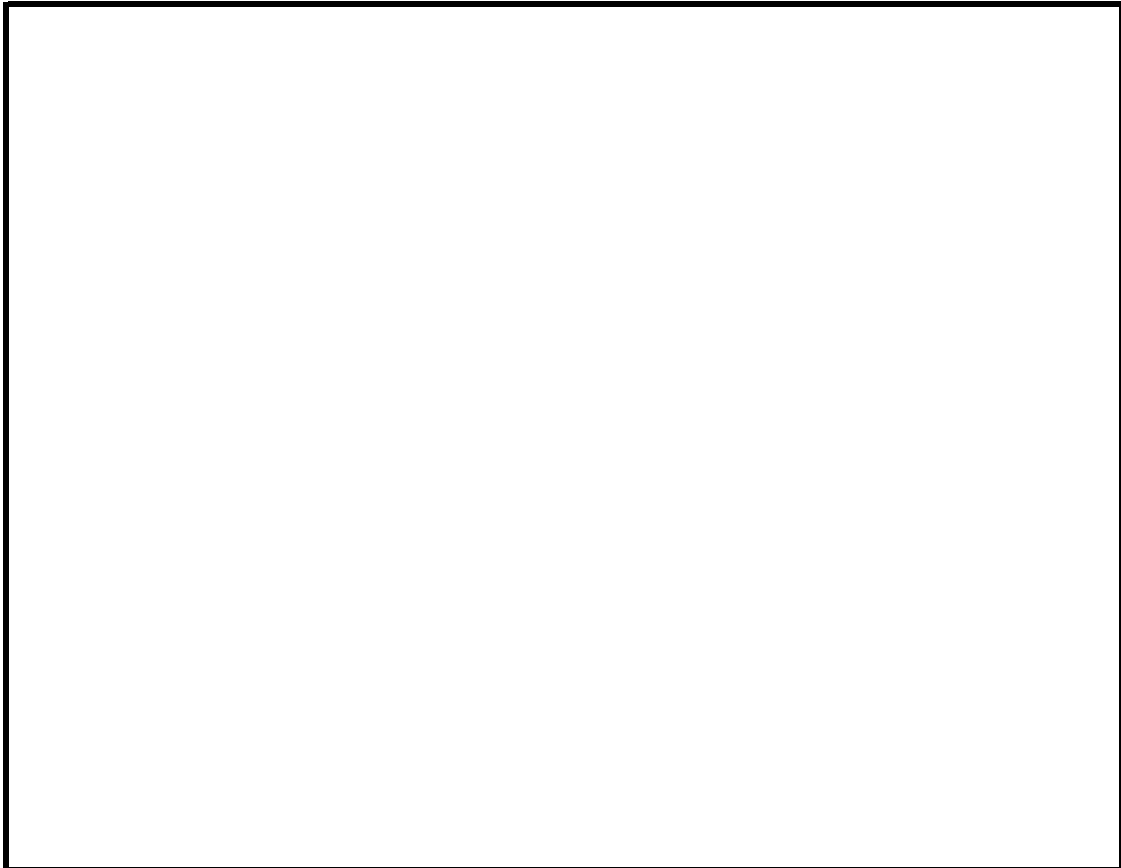

Cheese- 1 pack

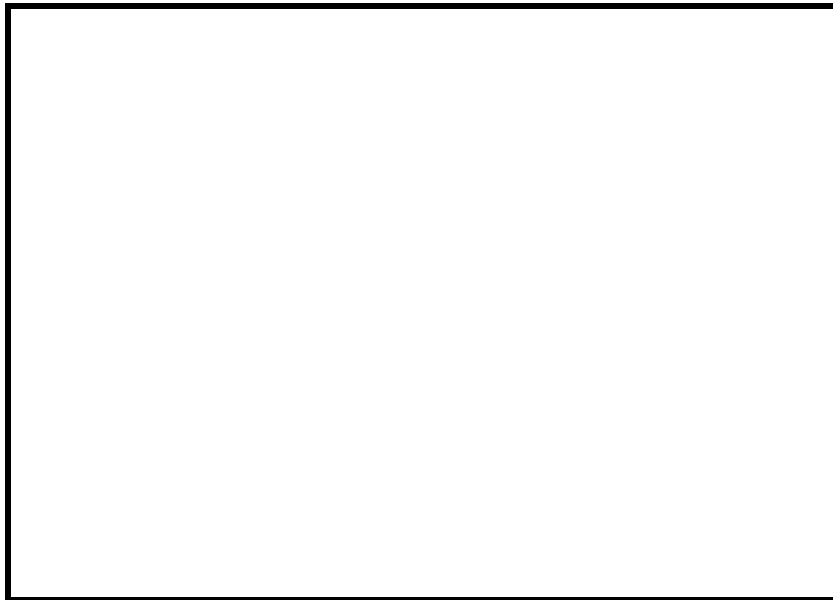
Cream- 300ml

- 5 Repeat step 4 two times and then add cream over it. Spread cream evenly. Dot it with butter.
- 6 Bake it in the oven at 180 degree Celcius for 40 mins.
- 7 Add some salt and pepper for taste.

South Africa : Nelson Mandela



Nelson Rolihlahla Mandela was a South African anti-apartheid revolutionary, political leader and philanthropist who served as President of South Africa from 1994 to 1999.

Read the following passage about him and answer the questions given.



Rolihlahla Mandela was born into the Madiba clan in the village of Mvezo, in the Eastern Cape, on 18 July 1918. His mother was Nonqaphi Nosekeni and his father was Nkosi Mphakanyiswa Gadla Mandela. He attended primary school in Qunu where his teacher, Miss Mdingane, gave him the name Nelson, in accordance with the custom of giving all school children "Christian" names. He joined the African National Congress in 1944 when he helped to form the ANC Youth League (ANCYL). On 12 June 1964 Mandela was convicted and was sentenced to life imprisonment. He was released on Sunday 11 February 1990. On 10 May 1994 he was inaugurated as South Africa's first democratically elected President. He died at his home in Johannesburg on 5 December 2013.
